

Steele County's Crops.

The weather the past week has been exceptionally fine for threshing operations and the busy threshing machines are kept humming from early morn until late night. The toot-toot signaling is heard from every direction and everybody is on the hustle. Crops are yielding good. Wheat is ranging from 20 to 35 bushels per acre, oats from 40 to 75; barley is exceptionally good, and the flax crop is looking fine. North Dakota has redeemed herself and we will "try and forget" last year.

How is this for a crop. Nels Groven, who lives south of town, threshed something over 2000 bushels from 65 acres. Over thirty bushels to the acre.

Tom Jorgenson, southwest of town, got 30 bushels of wheat per acre straight and 50 bushels of oats to the acre, which was not so bad.

Swen Olson, our own Swen, got 28 bushels per acre of wheat off his farm northwest of town and Swen cracks his face when he thinks about it.
