

## Two New Towns

McVille and Tolna The  
New G. N. Towns Are  
Now Platted And Some  
Eighty Business Lots  
Sold.

### BUILDING IN PROGRESS

The new towns of McVille and Tolna on the new extension of the Great Northern in Nelson county promise to be hummers, judging from the demand for lots in both places.

A representative of the Pioneer was at Aneta last Friday and attended the sale, which, by the way, was one of the most spirited in the history of the state. At an early hour President Tallman, of the Northern Town and Land Company, and his clerical force began business and before noon over fifty business lots were sold and before night eighty-six business lots and a number of residence lots were disposed of.

McVille, which is located on section 35-150-59, Nelson county, about a mile and a half south of

the old town of McVille, is beautifully situated; has excellent water and splendid drainage and is only a short distance from the beautiful Sheyenne River. The country surrounding is one of the finest agricultural districts in the state and is populated by a fine class of people many of whom are old settlers and in splendid circumstances.

Tolna, the next town on the line is twelve miles northwest of McVille and is located about four miles south of the historic Stump Lake. This town also has the promise of being a winner as the demand for locations shows. The natural advantages could not be better than they are in this new town and there is no reason why it should not be as large as its neighbor to the south.

It will not be long until these towns will spring into existence as if by magic. Already lumber is being transported overland and the sound of hammer and saw is heard from daylight until dark. Most lines of business are represented and a newspaper will be published in each town in a short time. Applications for several elevator sites have been made and these will no doubt be built and ready for business before this season's crop is ready for market.

There are good openings for someone with a little capital to put in good first-class hotels.

There will be two other good towns on the line in Ramsey county, which have not been platted as yet, but the work is being pushed as rapidly as possible, and as soon as finished will be put on the market. This sale will be held in about two weeks at Devils Lake.
