

OBITUARY.

James Taylor was born at Wood Grange, Ireland, in 1850. Died at Grafton, N. Dak., Saturday, May 20, 1905.

He was the youngest of a family of nine children. He came to Westfield, Wisconsin, in 1879. Two years later he was married to Miss Elizabeth Robinson, of that place. The same year he settled in Fargo and later moved to Steele county.

For the past sixteen years he has been in very ill-health, gradually failing and of late years he has been a helpless invalid. His condition was such that his family could not properly care for him and a year ago he was taken to Grafton. Death came as a blessing to relieve his sufferings. During his affliction he became an earnest Christian, striving to make up for the mistakes of his youth. He longed that his days might be prolonged, that he might be able to exert his influence for righteousness.

He leaves a wife and seven children, a sister in Wisconsin, and a brother and a sister in Ireland.

The remains were brought to this place, arriving here Monday. The funeral services were held from the M. E. church Monday afternoon at 1 o'clock, Rev. Roush officiating.
