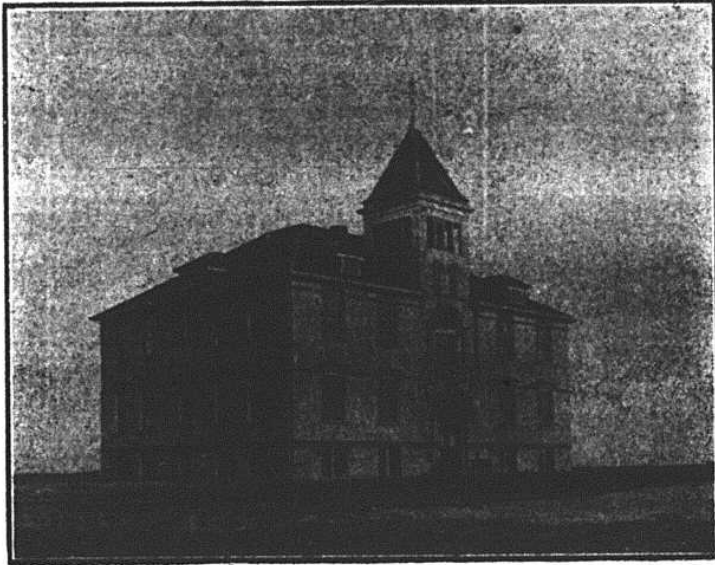


# The Hope Public Schools

Will Open Monday, September 7th.



On Monday, September 7th school will open. Pupils should bring their certificates of promotion the first day and go to the rooms they were in last year.

All children entering school for the first time must enroll before the first of October. Children under six cannot be admitted as the work is too hard for them. Children who enter school too young have not a fair opportunity and thus fail at the close of the year. It is hoped all children will be present the first day.

## HOPE PUBLIC SCHOOL

The aim of the Hope Public School is two-fold.

First, it requires a thoro course in the common school subjects.

Second, it offers a course that will further fit young people for a more active and responsible citizenship as well as preparing them to enter college.

## BUILDING AND EQUIPMENT.

Modern brick building consisting of twelve rooms is located in the eastern part of the city. All rooms are large, thoroly ventilated, well lighted and comfortably heated. The rooms are well equipped with furniture, maps, and supplementary reading. The High School has a reference library of 1000 volumes. The science department is equipped with apparatus for teaching physics, botany and chemistry.

## TEACHERS.

There are ten teachers including the superintendent. All grade teachers

must be graduates of Normal schools and have experience, or have special training and experience in the subjects they teach. High School teachers must be graduates of standard colleges or universities and have experience in the art of teaching.

## COURSE OF STUDY.

The course of study published by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction is followed in the grades. This course of study gives a complete outline of the work required by each grade. Four year's work is required in the high school. Algebra, geometry, physics, botany, chemistry, four years of Latin, three of history, two of German, music, drawing, and other subjects are taught in the high school.

## CLASSIFICATION OF SCHOOL.

The State High School Board has placed Hope school upon the first class list. This classification means that the work in the entire school

must be of the highest standard, subject to the State High School inspector and four years of high school work must be completed before students can graduate. Graduates of high school are admitted to the standard universities and can graduate from either of the State Normal Schools by taking one year of professional study. This is equivalent to holding a certificate of the first grade.

## ADMISSION.

Parents moving to the city of Hope may rest assured that their children will have the opportunity of attending a first class school. No room will be over-crowded and there will be a place for every child. Young people who have completed the course of study for the common schools and have certificates issued by the county superintendent will be admitted to the high school. Students from other schools that do not offer a four years' high school course are invited to join the high school classes and complete their work. A common school education at the present time is absolutely necessary and a high school education is a very essential and valuable equipment. A good education belongs to you as long as you live and opens the way to many opportunities.

The co-operation of all is solicited in maintaining a standard school that will meet the educational demands of the city and community.
