

COUNCIL DOINGS

A special meeting of the City Council was held Tuesday evening, May 19. Present President Ehred, and Aldermen Major, Hanley, Fisher, Fuller and Roney.

The street committee then made the following recommendations, to-wit:

We, the undersigned, as street committee of the City of Hope, N. D. recommend the following streets worked and brought to grade:

Between blocks 43 & 44 and 37 & 38 Small ave., between blocks 38 & 43, 37 & 44, 36 & 45, 35 & 46, 34 & 47 Seventh st., between blocks 28 & 29, 35 & 36 Hubbard ave.

On Steele avenue from the G. N. R. R. west to section line and from west end Steele avenue south to Humphrey avenue on old Dan Nelson corner.

To repair township road west of G. N. R. R. between section 31 in Hugo and section 2 in Hope township.

We also recommend that the gutters be opened from 4th street to 9th street on Steele avenue, sufficient to carry the water to 9th street. Also, to repair Steele avenue in front of Dan Gumb's with gravel and fill such other places on main street that is necessary.

We also recommend that we do not work less than six teams and have an extra man on the dump all the time, and a man to hold the wheelers and when Mr. Standley & Bergman needs a team or two, that they look after them.

We also recommend that Mr. Larimore does not put on any of his teams and hires teams in town of the taxpayers of the City of Hope, providing such teams can be secured.

Moved by Major seconded by Hanley that report of sidewalk committee recommending putting in walk on west side of Lot 13 Blk. 28 be adopted and same advertised. Carried.

There being no further business council adjourned.
