

# LEONARD KIMBALL KILLED

Funeral services for late Leonard Kimball, the 20-year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Porter Kimball, were held yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the residence, 208 Tenth street north, Rev. Herbert Tilden, pastor of the First Baptist church, officiating. Besides relatives, a number of friends attended the funeral services, including the members of this year's high school graduating class who were in the city. There were many floral tributes. The services were simple but impressive, Rev. Tilden's remarks being very comforting. Mrs. Dilworth rendered a sweet vocal selection, which was much appreciated by the bereaved. Interment was made by Wasem & Gaard at Riverside cemetery on the south side.

Further particulars regarding the tragedy were received yesterday. It seems that Leonard was employed under his father as foreman over a body of workmen. At 5:20 o'clock, Wednesday evening, while the crew was at work a wire cable working through a pulley and attached to a string of dump cars to prevent their moving too rapidly down a heavy grade existing near Albany, Minn., became broke. The young man stepped to the side of the track to see what could be done to prevent a smash-up and became entangled in a loop. The cable was being rapidly dragged thru the pulley by the loosened cars and Leonard's body was jerked with terrific speed over 200 feet of ground and thru the air. When he reached the pulley block the coil in the cable straightened out, freeing the body, which was hurled high into the air. When it fell it struck upon a rock, breaking the young man's legs and arms and injuring his spine. Medical attention was secured at once but the attending physician could render no effective aid and death took place at 6:10 p. m., fifty minutes after the accident.
