

Hubbard Knapp, Deed.

On Sunday morning, March 17, 1907, at 2 o'clock, occurred the death of one of Griggs county's prosperous and respected farmers, Hubbard Knapp, of Helena township, whose demise was due to Bright's disease and general debility. Mr. Knapp was a native of the state of Ohio, born at Oberlin, March 11, 1837. He was married Dec. 5, 1860, Prairie Round, Mich., to Miss Sarah H. Childs. To this union were born four children, two of whom survive, Mrs. B. N. Wheeling and Mason Knapp, sheriff of Griggs county, both of Cooperstown. Mrs. Knapp died in 1872. In 1876, Mr. Knapp was married to Miss Alice V. Longwell, and to this union were born five children, Boyd Knapp now of Binford; George Knapp, of Rose Glenn, F. D.; Mrs. Walter Richardson, of Hannaford; Mrs. Frank Meyers, of Akeley, Minn., and Clayton, the youngest, who is still at home, all of whom, together with the wife and mother, survive.

Ten years ago, March 1897, the family moved to Griggs county from the old home in Michigan and settled on the farm in Helena where the family home has since been. Mr. Knapp was a frugal and industrious man, he was not a sectarian but respected the creeds of others and gave of his goods for the upbuilding of the church.

The funeral was held yesterday, Wednesday, March 20, 1907, from the house at 1 p. m., and interment was made in the cemetery adjoining the Mable Hartman Memorial church.

The whole community unites with the bereaved family in mourning the loss of one who has ever been an honor to his race.
