

The remains of Norman Brown were brought home from West Superior last Friday morning on the train and were accompanied by his father and Frank Retzlaff. The funeral took place in the Congregational church on the afternoon of that day the funeral sermon being preached by Rev. V. H. Ruring. The remains were interred in the Cooperstown cemetery. The deceased was taken sick with lagrippe and a few days after wrote home that he was better. He suffered a relapse and went to St. Francis hospital at West Superior. In addition to the grippe he was afflicted with quinsy, the two together resulting in his death. He was 23 years old and was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. B. B. Brown. He was a member of the Maccabees and carried a \$2,000 policy. Norman was a hard worker and had rustled for himself for a number of years. He was cheerful and popular with his friends, who mourn his early demise.
