

—We received word that Mrs. Amy J. Drummond, Mrs. T. J. Foster's mother died at 6-30 Sunday morning, June 2nd. at the old home—stead, Rolling Prairie, Ind. Death was the result of old age, she being in her 81st year. Mrs. Drummond's maiden name was Bowoll. She was born Aug. 27th 1814, on a farm near Charleston, Clarke County, Ind. Her father being a farmer and merchant, she received a good education, having attended the best educational Institutions of the day. Deceased possessed a fine mind, was very intellectual, and had an unusual aptitude for business for the days of her early womanhood. She lived at Rolling Prairie since early 1836. Mrs. Drummond was the mother of three children, Annie E., wife of the late T. J. Foster, La Porte, Ind., Margaret J., wife of Jesso Oglesby, a farmer of Wills township, and Marietta, wife of George W. Roe, of Chicago. The funeral was Wednesday, at 4 p. m., June 5th, deceased having requested that her remains be kept three days and three nights before burial. Rev. Wm. M. Roe, of Buchanan, Mich., officiating at the funeral. The body was buried in the family cemetery known as the Bowell, consisting of land given by Mrs. Drummond's father, it being the very spot of ground on which he pitched his tent at his first settlement in that country.
