

## Obituary.

Miss Emilia A. Harmeson was born in Canada, August 7, 1866. She moved with her mother and step-father, Mr. and Mrs. Necker, to Sanborn, N. D., when the country was first being settled, and lived there until about a year ago, when she was married to Mr. Harmeson.

Since their marriage they lived near Valley City, until last spring when they moved to Steele county.

Mrs. Harmeson was taken sick Friday, July 31, in the morning, but was not thought seriously ill until 2 o'clock, that afternoon. She died the following Sunday, August 2, at 20 minutes to 10 in the evening.

The interment was to take place at Sanborn, on Tuesday, but by Monday evening, it was seen that the remains could not be moved if left another day, so the neighbors and friends gathered, and buried the body, in Peterson's cemetery, at midnight, of the 3.

The deceased leaves a husband and step-son, besides many friends to mourn her departure.

Mrs. Harmeson has been a great sufferer, from her childhood, but she is at rest now.
