

An Awful Murder.

Sanborn, Nov. 9.—On Friday morning last, an old farmer by the name of Ferdinand Klimschmidt, living a few miles south of here, killed his son Charles with a club, while in a passion. The murdered son was a man about 30 years of age and considered of dull intellect. The details of the crime are most revolting. The father ordered the son, while in bed to get up and leave the premises, because he ate so much and did so little work. In the altercation which followed the old man clubbed his son about the head, dragged him from the house and left him lying outside during the day, until neighbors found out what had happened and interfered. He was too badly injured, however, to receive help and died during the night. Klimschmidt was arrested and a coroner's jury impanelled, who returned a verdict that Charles Klimschmidt came to his death at the hands of his father. In accordance with the justice frequently meted out in this state, the murderer has not even been placed in jail, but has been allowed his liberty under the care of a deputy sheriff, in order that he might better look after the disposal of his property.
