The course of study in the Hope Public Schools embraces four departments: Primary, Intermediate, Grammar and High School.

The Primary department consists of two grades of one year each.

The Intermediate department consists of four grades of one year each.

The Grammar department consists of two grades of one year each.

The High School consists of three grades of one year each.

At present we have an excellent library of 800 volumes, including standard works of History, biography, poetry, fiction and reference books. The schools are adequately equipped with all accessories in the way of dictionaries, globes, maps, etc.

At the beginning of the school year, the Board of Education increased the High School curriculum one year and are contemplating the addition of the fourth year which will make our curriculum second to none in the state.

The High School is well equipped with such apparatus as is necessary for efficient work and affords excellent opportunities to all who desire to prepare for University training.

The course gives great freedom of choice to the student, who may select subjects to his tastes and aptitude. Great emphasis is placed on the courses in English, which is a prime requisite in all educational attainments.

Reading, writing, spelling and language are the indices of scholarship and are given careful attention throughout the grades.

The discipline of the schools is excellent and the hearty cooperation of teachers and students is manifest on every hand.

Patrons are cordially invited to visit the schools, which will add to the interest and give encouragement to the teachers.
