

Old Pioneer Gone.

One of Steele County's pioneer settlers died last Sunday morning at about two o'clock, death being due, it is supposed, to cerebral hemorrhage. Mr. Pope had been feeling unusually well for some time and was in town the day before. He retired that night feeling well, but some time after was taken with severe vomiting. This ceased, however, in a short time, and he went to sleep, apparently feeling as well as usual. About one o'clock he again awakened, and this time medical assistance was deemed advisable and Dr. Philip was sent for. Mr. Pope again went to sleep, and about two o'clock he was found to be dead, death having come to him in his sleep without the knowledge of any one and without a struggle on his part.

Deceased was born in Kentucky in 1837, where he lived until 1856, when he moved to Illinois and made his home there until 1882. He then came to North Dakota and took a homestead in Broad-

lawn township, this county, where he has since resided. A large number of relatives and friends are called upon to mourn the death of a man who has been liked, respected and honored by all who knew him.
