

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS.**Official Proceedings of the Board of
County Commissioners of
Steele County**

Sherbrooke, N. D., February 18th, 1901.

Board of County Commissioners convened at 10 o'clock a. m. pursuant to adjournment. Present, Commissioners Horner, Johnson and Elliott.

The minutes of the meeting of Feb. 4th 1901 were read and approved.

On motion the sum of \$525.05 was ordered transferred from the special salary fund to the county general fund.

The board took up the consideration of bridge business.

A petition signed by R R Fisher and others, asking for an appropriation of \$150.00 to assist in the construction of a grade, on line between sections 6 and 7 Hope township, was presented to the board.

On motion the board adjourned until 1:30 o'clock p. m., of same day.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Board re-convened at 1:30 o'clock p. m., pursuant to adjournment. All members present.

On motion a committee consisting of Commissioners Gray, Elliott and Johnson was appointed to inspect grade site between sections 6 and 7 Hope township.

The committee appointed to inspect sites for bridges petitioned for between sections 12 and 13 Highland township, filed their reports, which report was accepted and the committee discharged.

The reports of the committees appointed to inspect sites of bridges petitioned for in Enger township and on line between sections 31 Sherbrooke and 36 Easton were, on motion, taken from the table, accepted and the committees discharged.

The county auditor was, on motion, ordered to advertise for bids for the construction of bridges as follows:

1. A pile bridge 100 ft. long between sections 22 and 27, Enger township.

2. Piling for bridge 16 ft. long between sections 11 and 12 Enger township.

3. A pile bridge 40 ft. long between sections 31 Sherbrooke and 36 Easton township.

4. Two pile bridges each 31 ft. long between sections 12 and 13 Highland township.

The report of C S Shippy in the matter of investigating alleged violations of the prohibition law was submitted to the board, and, on motion, accepted and fees ordered paid from the liquor prosecution fund as follows:
