

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

Official Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of Steele County

Sherbrooke, N. D., October 29, 1901.

Board of county commissioners convened at 9 o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment.

All members present.

The minutes of the meeting of Oct. 7th, 1901, were read, and on motion approved.

The petition of K. S. Knutson, and others of Primrose township, asking for the county to construct a high water bridge across south branch of the Goose river, between sections 12 and 13 Primrose township, was presented to the board.

On motion a committee consisting of H J Rindy, W E Elliott and Frank Gray was appointed to inspect site of bridge petitioned for.

The justice report of E D Washburn for 3rd quarter of 1901 was, on motion, approved and fees ordered paid from liquor prosecution fund as follows:

L A Jacobson, trustee of incorporated town of Hope, appeared before the board and made application on behalf of said incorporated town of Hope for a county quit claim deed to lots 1 to 24 inclusive, of block 3 first addition to incorporated town of Hope and offering to pay for same the sum of \$20.55.

On motion said application was granted and the chairman of the board of county commissioners authorized to execute a county quit claim deed to all of block three, first addition to the incorporated town of Hope upon payment in to county treasury of the sum of \$20.55.

L A Jacobson, trustee of incorporated town of Hope, presented application for an assignment to said incorporated town of Hope of the tax judgment held by Steele county against lots 1 to 24 inclusive, block 3 first addition to incorporated town of Hope for taxes 1888, 1889 and 1890, and offering to pay for said assignment of tax judgment the sum of \$14.45.

Said application was, on motion, granted and the treasurer of Steele county authorized to assign to the incorporated town of Hope all of block 3, of first addition to Hope upon payment into the county treasury of the sum of \$14.45.

On motion the board adjourned until 1:30 o'clock p. m., of same day.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Board re-convened at 1:30 o'clock p. m., pursuant to adjournment. All members present.

The application of L A Roney for a county quit claim deed to lots 17, 18, 19 and 20, block 47, original townsite of Hope, and agreeing to pay for same the sum of \$14.51 was, on motion, granted, and county quit claim deed ordered executed to L A Roney, he having deposited \$14.51 with the county treasurer.

Oscar Cummings appeared before the board and asked that his personal property taxes for the year 1901, in township of Sherbrooke be abated in the sum of \$40.00, for the reason that his personal property assessment for said year was unjust in that it was assessed higher in proportion to value than other similar property in said township.

It appeared to the board that the personal property of Oscar Cummings, for the year 1900, had been excessively and unjustly assessed on motion it was ordered that the valuation of said personal property be reduced in the sum of \$300, and that the personal property taxes, of Oscar Cummings, for said year, be abated in the sum of \$18.50.
