School in all the grades opened Monday and teachers and students manifest interest and industry. A systematic course of drawing has been planned and will be taught throughout the grades this term.

Biology, Physiography and Ancient History have been introduced this semester and a goodly number have elected each subject.

The class in Physiography has finished its discussion of "The Earth as a Planet", and in accordance with the Nebular Hypothesis is in a position to explain the origin and creation of the earth.

The Botanical department is studying germination and performing experiments with the compound microscope.

The class in Chemistry finished Sulphur last week and have taken up the study of Phosphorus. A syllabus in Chemistry has been prepared by the Superintendent which greatly facilitates this department.
