

Somewhat Mysterious

From the Hillsboro Banner:

Theo. Schultz, of Columbus, Ind., was in the city yesterday, having come here in search of his nephew, Martin Bauricher, who left his home in the above Indiana town several weeks ago.

On August 5th a telescope grip was left on the Kaldor bridge in Norway township. It remained there several days, and when finally Lars Overmoen, a farmer of the neighborhood, opened it he found it to contain a couple of blue flannel shirts, some underwear and other wearing apparel, and on top of these a sheet of paper on which was written in a bold hand,

"Martin Bauricher,
Columbus, Indiana."

Circumstances pointed to probable suicide and Mr. Overmoen brought the grip to Hillsboro and turned it over to States Attorney Kaldor, who wrote the Columbus authorities about the matter, with the result that Mr. Schultz has come to find, if possible, some trace of his missing nephew.

The suicide theory is contra-

dicted by the fact that the missing man's folks received a postal card supposed to have been written by him and dated at Pickart, N. D. This was postmarked at Chicago on August 15, which would indicate that it had been written on the 13th or 14th, eight or nine days after the grip was left on the bridge.

Mr. Schultz says that Bauricher acted queerly at times. He left home in the night without the knowledge of his friends and against the wishes of his mother. Indications are that he is mentally deranged and may turn up among the living somewhere. He has talked at times of going west to take up a claim and may have left home with that object in view.
