Gaboose Wrecked

The east bound freight pulled into the yards Saturday morning minus the caboose which had been left in the ditch about two miles north of this place. The car broke its link and jumped the track carrying with it Conductor Murphy and Ben Wasem, traveling salesman for Wasem & Gaard's Music House at Fargo. The injured men were brot to town and placed under the care of Dr. Philip, the Company's surgeon who made them as comfortable as possible. The two men were in the caboose when it flew the track, tumbling over and over and being badly smashed. Both men were hurled against the side of the car and had very narrow escapes from sustaining fatal injuries. Mr. Wasem's collar and tie were torn com-pletely off and it was almost a miracle that he was not injured more than turned out to be the case. Conductor Murphy was carried thru to Breckenridge the same evening and Mr. Wasem was left at Casselton to be conveyed to his home at Fargo over the Northern Pacific.
