The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 9 o'clock A. M.; present K S Sulland, Frank Gray, G O Johnson and K A Johnson; Minutes of the meeting of Feby. 15th 06; read and on motion approved.

On motion made, seconded and carried, it was ordered that the States Attorney be instructed and authorized to collect, as provided by law, the amount due the county for care and maintainence of Anna Rud at asylum at Jamestown.

On motion a formal ballot was taken for the election of a Supt. of the County Board of Health and a Vice-President, which resulted as follows: Dr. H Bacharach receiving four votes for Supt. and Frank Gray four votes for Vice-President; Dr. H Bacharach was declared duly elected Supt. and Frank Gray Vice-President of the Board of Health for a period of one year dating from April 1st 1906.

On motion duly seconded and carried Atty Geo Murray and Dr. A J Heilmark was appointed Commissioners of Insanity for a period of two years dating from April 1st 1906.
