April 3rd, 1905.

The Board of County Commissioners convened in regular session at 9 o'clock a. m. Present, F. Gray, G. O. Johnson, K. S. Sulland and H. N. Horner.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Board of County Commissioners reconvened at 1:30 p. m. Present, F. Gray, G. O. Johnson, K. S. Sulland and H. N. Horner.

The statements of fees collected by Clerk of Court for quarter ending March 31st, 1905, aggregating \$158.50 was on motion approved.

The statements of fees collected by Register of Deeds for quarter ending March 31st, 1905, aggregating \$741.25, was on motion approved.

The following petitions for bridges and grade appropriations were presented:

For bridge on line between sections 15 and 22, Broadlawn twp.

For an appropriation of \$200.00 for grading on line between sections 22 and 27, Greenview twp.

For an appropriation of \$500.00 for grading on line between sections 23 and 14 and 24 and 13, Sharon twp.

On motion the Chairman appointed H. N. Horner, G. O. Johnson and K. A. Johnson to inspect grade sites in Sharon twp.; H. N. Horner and G. O. Johnson to inspect grade site in Greenview twp.; and F. Gray and K. S. Sulland to inspect bridge site in Broadlawn twp.

The bonds of the Fargo Bridge & Iron Works and The Northwestern Bridge Co., covering bridge contracts, was on motion approved.

The petition of C. T. Eevdy for abatement of all his 1904 personal property tax in Sherbrooke twp, was on motion granted, evidence having been shown that the said property had been assessed and taxes paid in Iowa.

The petition of T. K. Sheetz for abatement of 1904 tax on threshing outfit assessed in Broadlawn twp. was on motion granted, the property having been assessed in both Broadlawn and Hugo twps.

The petition of H. A. Northrop for abatement of one School poll assessed in Willow Lake twp. for year 1904, was on motion granted. Mr. Northrop having been assessed School polls in both Willow Lake twp. and city of Hope.

The petition of Geo. Bye for abatement of one School poll assessed in Newburgh twp. for year 1904, was on motion granted as the party was not of age at time of assessment.

On motion the Board of County Commissioners proceeded to take a formal ballot for Supt. of County Board of Health for a period of one year dating from April 1st, 1905:

The first ballot resulted in unanimous vote for Dr. W. H. M. Philip, who was declared elected Supt. of Board of Health.

The Board then proceeded to take a formal ballot for Vice President of County Board of Health for a period of one year dating from April 1st, 1905.

First ballot resulted—H. N. Horner, 2; G. O. Johnson, 1; K. S. Sulland, 1.

Second ballot—G. O. Johnson, 1; K. S. Sulland, 1; F. Gray, 1; H. N. Horner, 1.

Third ballot—G. O. Johnson, 2; F. Gray, 2.

Fourth ballot—F. Gray, 1; G. O. Johnson, 3.

G. O. Johnson was declared elected Vice President of Board of Health.

On motion duly seconded and carried it was decided that the places for holding chattel mortgage sales should remain the same as designated April 4th, 1904.
