A petition was presented, asking to have bridge on quarter line in section 10 Enger twp. repaired; on motion said petition was laid on the table until April meeting.

On motion adjournment was taken till 1:30 P. M. same day.

AFTERNOON SESSION.
The Board of County Commissioners reconvened at 1:30 P. M. pursuant to adjournment; all members present.

The committee appointed to inspect bridge and grade sites, made the following report:
We recommend that a 16ft. wood pile bridge be built on line between sections 17 and 18 Golden Lake twp.; that a 24ft wood pile bridge be built on line between sections 29 and 28 Beaver Creek twp.; that a 62ft wood pile bridge be built on line between sections 26 and 35 Newburgh twp.; that the petition for a bridge on line between sections 3 and 10 Enger twp. be laid on the table; that petition for replanking bridge on line between sections 8 and 9 Primrose twp. be rejected and necessary repairs having already been made; that a 50ft wood pile bridge be built on line between sections 3 and 10 Primrose twp.; that a 58ft wood pile bridge be built on line between sections 24 and 25 Primrose twp.; that the county furnish the lumber only, to replank bridge on line between sections 32 and 33 Newburgh twp. and that the twp. bear the expense of having the work done; that a 24ft wood pile bridge be built on line between secs. 32 and 33 Golden Lake twp.; that a 12ft wood pile bridge be built on line between section 1 Edendale and section 36 Primrose twps; that a 32ft wood pile bridge be built on line between sections 3 Colgate and 35 and 36 Hugo; that a 32 ft wood pile bridge be built on or near line between sections 15 and 16 Easton twps; that old bridge on line between sections 1 and 12 Primrose twp. be repaired by driving two rows of 30 ft cedar piling, 5 in each row, on each side of channel of river and other necessary repairs be made; that petition for a bridge on line between sections 12 and 13 Broadlawn twp. be placed on the table. The report of the committee was on motion accepted, approved and adopted as the action of the Board and committee discharged.

The auditor was on motion instructed to advertise for bids for building 9 new bridges and furnishing material and repairing two bridges, as per recommendations of the bridge committee, bids to be opened at 2 o'clock P. M. Feb. 15th 1906, all of said bridges and repair work to be completed on or before July 1st 1906; bidders to furnish certified check to the amount of \$500.00 payable to the chairman of the Board of County Commissioners.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the Steele County Tribune, Hope Pioneer and Finley Beacon were designated as official papers for Steele County for ensuing year; all legal notices to be published in one paper, except as

otherwise provided by law; and that the official proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners also be published in the Sharon Reporter.

The auditor was on motion authorized to issue warrant for transfer of \$485.15, balance in Register of Deeds special salary fund for the year ending Dec. 31st 05, to the County general fund.

The County Treasurer's salary for the ensuing year, based upon the assessed valuation of the County, was estimated at \$1600.00, and on motion the Auditor was authorized to draw a salary warrant, at the end of each month, for one twelfth of said amount.

The Superintendent of Schools' salary for the ensuing year, based upon the number of schools over which he had supervision, taught four months or more during preceding school year, was fixed at \$1190.00 and on motion the Auditor was authorized to draw salary warrant at end of each month for one twelfth of said amount.

Pursuant to Chapter 63 section 7598, Revised Codes of 1899, the County Judge additional salary, under the prohibition law, was fixed at \$103.39 per annum, based upon the 1905 census, and on motion the Auditor was authorized to issue salary warrant at end month for one twelfth of said amount.

On motion, seconded and carried, an informal ballot was taken for the appointment of a County Justice of the Peace to fill the vacancy caused by Wm. Palmer ceasing to be a resident of the County; G. A. Monteith having received five votes on first ballot, was declared duly appointed County Justice of the Peace to fill balance of unexpired term of Wm. Palmer.

On motion the Board adjourned till 9 o'clock A. M. Jan. 4th 1906.
