## OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS

Official Proceedings of the Board  
of County Commissioners  
Of Steele County.

Sherbrooke, N. Dak., July 13th, 1905.  
The Board of County Commissioners  
reconvened at 9 o'clock a. m., pursuant  
to adjournment. All members present.  
Minutes of the meeting of July 7th,  
1905, read and on motion approved.

On motion the Board proceeded to  
take a ballot for the appointment of two  
county physicians, which resulted as  
follows: For south half of the county;  
first ballot, Dr. W. H. M. Philip receiving  
five votes. For the north half of  
the county; first ballot, A. J. Heimark  
3, H. Bacharach 1, one blank ballot be-  
ing cast. Dr. W. H. M. Philip was de-  
clared appointed County Physician for  
the south half of the county and Dr. A.  
J. Heimark for the north half, for a per-  
iod of one year dating from July 1st,  
1905.

Motion made, seconded and carried,  
that the county physicians' salary be  
fixed at \$250.00 each, per year; and that  
they furnish all medicine, medical and  
surgical aid for the county poor.

The office of County Surveyor being  
vacant, R. D. Ross and M. Brumwell  
made application for the appointment.

On motion duly seconded and carried,  
M. Brumwell was appointed County  
surveyor, to fill the unexpired term of  
C. W. Connor.

A requisition for 55 jurors having  
been received from the Clerk of the Dis-  
trict Court, they were on motion appor-  
tioned to be drawn from the several  
townships, cities and villages as follows:  
Newburgh 3, Beaver Creek 3, Westfield  
2, Sharon 3, Enger 3, Golden Lake 2,

Finley 2, Franklin 3, Primrose 3, Sher-  
brooke 3, Easton 2, Greenview 2, Eden-  
dale 2, Hugo 2, Melrose 2, Riverside 2,  
Broadlawn 2, Colgate 3, Carpenter 2,  
Willow Lake 2, City of Hope 5, Finley  
2.

On motion a petition for a bridge and  
an appropriation for grading on line be-  
tween Section 3, Colgate, and 35 and 36,  
Hugo, was laid on the table.

On motion the Chairman appointed  
H. N. Horner, G. O. Johnson and K. A.  
Johnson as a committee to inspect site  
for grading on line between sections 27  
and 28, 21 and 22 Finley twp.

On motion the following petitions  
were taken from the table and rejected:  
Petition for an appropriation of \$250.00  
for grading on line between section 34,  
Golden Lake, and section 3, Sherbrooke;  
petition for an appropriation of \$250.00  
for grading on line between section 3  
and 10, Golden Lake.

On motion it was ordered that school  
polls assessed P. J. Ostmo, in Beaver  
Creek twp. for years 1903 and 1904, be  
abated, as the same had been assessed  
and paid in Grand Forks county.

On motion adjournment was taken  
until 1:30 p. m., same day.

### AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Board reconvened at 1:30 p. m.  
All members present.

Petitions having been presented to  
the Board for the appointment of a  
drainage commission, on motion the ap-  
pointments were made as follows: S. L.  
Linn, Chas. Chalmers and R. A. Pope;  
amount of their bonds being fixed at  
\$1,000.00 each.

Dr. W. H. M. Philip having resigned  
as Superintendent of County Board of  
Health, on motion duly seconded and  
carried, Dr. M. C. Johnston was appoint-  
ed Supt. of the County Board of Health,  
for a period of one year dating from  
April 1st, 1905.

J. J. Wamberg, N. N. Lunding and B.  
T. Kraebel appeared before the Board  
and presented petitions for an appropri-  
ation of \$400.00 for grading on line be-  
tween section 1, City of Hope, and sec-  
tion 12, Carpenter.

On motion seconded and carried, it  
was ordered that an appropriation not  
to exceed \$300.00 be made for grading  
on line between section 1, City of Hope  
and Sec. 12, Carpenter.

The justice report of E. D. Washburn,  
for quarter ending June 30th, 1905, was  
on motion approved and fees ordered  
paid as follows: E. D. Washburn, jus-  
tice fees, case State vs. Wm. V. Pick-  
ins, \$1.95; W. E. Elliott, sheriff fees,  
\$9.00; E. D. Washburn, justice fees, case  
State vs. Louis E. Lalken, \$2.35; W. E.  
Elliott, sheriff fees, \$9.10; E. D. Wash-  
burn, justice fees, case State vs. Phil.  
Young, \$2.45; Frank Bissell, constable  
fees, \$2.00.

The coroner's report in the matter of  
an Inquisition upon the body of Clara  
E. Christopherson, was on motion ap-  
proved and coroner's fees to the amount  
of \$5.60 allowed.

The committee appointed to inspect  
new bridges reported that they found  
them all satisfactory except bridge No.  
4, between sections 27 and 31, Enger  
twp., which they rejected on account of  
said bridge not having been built in a  
satisfactory manner and in accordance  
with contract, payment for building the  
same to be withheld until bridge is re-  
built and accepted by the Board.
