Dear Superintendent or Principal:

At a recent meeting of the State High School Board several matters

- of importance to the high schools of the state were considered and action was decided upon some: 1. In no case does the High School
- Board consider it proper to graduate pupils who have not completed all of
- the constants required by the high school course. What these are, may be ascertained by referring to the
- Manual. 2. That hereafter, to no pupils who have received a credit from the High School Board in general history will-certificates be issued in ancient and modern history. It has been found that many pupils have been able to
- secure three credits for one year's work in General history. 3. That on and after September 1909 manual training and domestic science shall be considered as a requirement for first class rating and that these subjects are strongly urged as part of the work to be offered by high schools of the second and third class. A more definite statement of
- what is required will be issued later. 4. That no examination will be of-fered by the High School Board in physiology and civics to grade pupils. 5. That commercial arithmetic be added to the list of electives as a one-
- half year credit. Board That the High School earnestly recommends that adequate provision be made in every building designed for high school purposes

for an assembly room and also a gymnasium, and that the matter of proper ventilation be given especial attention. I has been ascertained by the High School Inspector that many buildings recently constructed for high school purposes are sadly de-ficient in these particulars. Yours respectfully,
