

Teachers' Meeting.

Teachers of the South Half of County hold Interesting Meeting.

At the teachers' meeting held in the high school room Nov. 23, twenty-one teachers of the southern part of the county were in attendance. The following is a copy of the minutes of the meeting.

Meeting was called to order at 11:00 o'clock by Supt. A. G. Miller.

After piano duet by Misses Joslyn and Danskin Supt. Miller presented a plan for a permanent organization which was discussed by Supt. Pierson and Miss Hill.

Miss Ruth Johnson was appointed temporary secretary.

The following motions were voted upon and carried.

1- That a permanent organization be formed for the southern section of Steele county with its center a Hope.

2- That the Supt. of the Hope schools act as president of the association.

3- That the president of the association together with the county Superintendent act as an executive committee with power to appoint other members.

4- That the executive committee consist of three members.

5- That a permanent secretary be elected.

6- That Miss Ruth M. Johnson act as permanent secretary.

The association then adjourned until one o'clock p. m.

The meeting was called to order for the afternoon session with Pres. Pierson in the chair.

A class of little boys under the management of Miss Mielke opened the meeting with a song.

Pres. Pierson then presented a very able paper after which the association adjourned to the Second grade room where Miss Violet Morrish conducted a model reading class.

Supt. Miller then explained his plan for the future work of the association which, in brief, was as follows:

That but two meetings be held each year, one early in the fall and the other in the spring.

That the spring meeting be held for two days.

That the first day Friday be given over to exhibits of school work done during the year and to oral contest work.

That this work be outlined by the Executive committee.

That the evening be given to declamatory work and the next day to regular association work

The plan was discussed by Supt. Pierson and Ex-county Superintendent Henry

Discussion of pupils reading circle work was opened by Ruth M. Johnson and further discussed by Superintendents Pierson and Miller.

The following subjects were then discussed.

Parents Day

Physiology in the lower grades

Teachers' reading circle work

Regularity in attendance.

The date of the next meeting was considered some time about March 10th was thought the best but nothing definite was decided.

The meeting then adjourned.
