On motion F. W. Ehred was elected secretary.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and on motion approved.

The question of when and how to hire teachers was opened for discussion by Supt. Miller and followed by E. H. Badger and others.

During the discussion Supt. W. L. Stockwell entered and gave a very interesting talk along the line of co-operation with the County Supt. in the matter of hiring teachers.

The meeting was then adjourned until 1:30 p. m.

At the specified time the meeting was reconvened.

The afternoon program was opened up with a song by the fourth grade of the Hope High School. The class was in charge of Miss Murray and Supt. Pierson and was rendered in a manner that reflected a great deal of credit upon the instructions given in the Hope school.

The song was followed by a very interesting and able address by W. L. Stockwell on the duties of the school officers and the function of the school.

"Free and Uniform Text-Books" was then taken up for discussion.

A list of books that had been selected during the summer by the county Supt. and the teachers at Summer School was read and discussed. On motion it was voted that the selected list of books be recommended for adoption in all the schools in Steele County.

After a few more short discussions the meeting adjourned subject to the call of the executive committee.—XXX
