Sarah Burbank Elliott was born June 14, 1834 in Canterbury, N. H. and for several years was an efficient teacher in Merri-mac county. They were married at Concord, N. H. in 1857. In Vermont they carried on a large dairy and stock farm, moving to N. Dak. in the spring of 1880, where they have since resided.
