

Jack Harris Dead.

Jack Harris, who has been suffering from burns received from an accident at the G. N. pump house south of this city since last December, and was later taken with scarlet fever, succumbed to this dreaded disease, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Johnson, yesterday morning at 9 o'clock. The deceased was well known in this city, having made this his home for a number of years. He leaves a number of brothers who reside in Canada, a wife, and a number of grown-up children, who live in South Dakota.

He was a member of Wilson Lodge A. F. & A. M. of Toronto, Canada, and at the request of his mother lodge Occidental lodge A. F. & A. M. of this city gave the body a Masonic burial. Interment was made in the Hope cemetery this afternoon at 2 o'clock. Owing to the disease being contagious no regular funeral service was conducted other than a short Masonic service at the grave and prayer by Rev. Hitchcock of the Congregational church. The deceased was a man about 60 years of age.
