Official Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of Steele County.

Sherbrooke, N. D., April 6th, 1908.
The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 9 o'clock A. M. All members present. Minutes of the meeting of January 8th 1908 read and on motion approved.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Board of County Commissioners reconvened at 1:30 P. M. All members present. The following resolution was on motion adopted all members voting aye:

Whereas: In conformity to a resolutions adopted by the County Commissioners Association of North Dakota at their meeting held in Fargo March 6th 08, and,

Whereas: Believing that a certain responsibility for the inequality of assessment falls upon the individual tax payer through lack of attention at the proper time, i. e. while being assessed and equalized by the local authorities, and to attempt to correct this evil, be it

Resolved: That hereafter no petition for abatement of assessment and taxes, which contains nothing but the question of equalization of values, be considered by this board except during the time they are in session as a board of equalization.

The following order of Incorporation was adopted by the Board:

The petition and application of Chas. Ellingson, L L Rinde, T S Hunt, C O Halgrims and others praying for the incorporation of certain territory in the County of Steele and State of North Dakota, and therein described as the Village of Sharon, as provided for by Chapter 31 of the Revised Codes of the State of North Dakota of 1905, having been presented to the board of County Commissioners of Steele County at their regular session this 6th day of April 1908, and upon examination of the application, census, petition, map and survey and the affidavits thereto attached verifying the facts set out in said application and the board being fully satisfied that all the requirements of said Chapter having been fully complied with, upon motion, duly ordered that the territory described in said petition, to-wit: Sections 25-26-27-34-35 and 36 of Sharon Township, Steele County, State of North Dakota, be an Incorporated Village under the name of the "Village of Sharon", which is a name different from that of every other village in the State of North Dakota, provided the resident voters of said territory shall so vote at the election which is hereby ordered to be held at the Sharon Town Hall a place within the territory proposed to be incorporated, on Tuesday the 5th day of May 1908: It is further ordered by said Board of County Commissioners that notice of said election be given by the county auditor as required by law.

George Murray and Dr A J Helmark were on motion appointed members of the Board of Insanity for a period of two years dating from April 1st 1908.

On motion J B Oxton was appointed Vice President and Dr H Bacharach Superintendent of the County Board of Health for a period of one year dating from April 1st 1908.

Chapter 71 of the Session Laws of 1907 requiring the county auditor to have all bonds which are required by law to be deposited in his office, recorded at length in the office of the Register of Deeds, and there being no provision for paying the recording fees, it was on motion ordered that said bonds be recorded at the expense of Steele County.

J B Oxton and Frank Gray was on motion appointed as a committee to appraise various lots owned by Steele County, as per list furnished by the auditor.

On motion the board adjourned until 9 o'clock a. m. Saturday, April 11th 1908.
