### Official Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners Of Steele County.

Sherbrooke, N. D., Jan. 7th 1907.  
The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 1 o'clock P. M. Present K. S. Sulland, Frank Gray, K. A. Johnson, G. O. Johnson and H. N. Horner. Minutes of the meeting of October 1st '06, November 14th and 15th '06, read and on motion approved. Bridge business was considered and the committee made the following report: We the committee appointed to inspect bridge and grade sites, make the following recommendations: That new bridges be built on lines between sections 31 Carpenter twp. and section 6 Barnes county; sections 15 and 16 Carpenter twp; sections 10 and 15 Carpenter twp.; sections 11 and 12 Carpenter twp; sections 18 and 19 Edendale twp; sections 12 Hugo and 7 Edendale twp; sections 16 and 21 Enger twp; sections 1 and 12 Beaver Creek twp; sections 10 and 11 Beaver Creek twp; section 36 Golden Lake and section 1. Sherbrooke twp; section 5 and 8 Greenview twp; between Steele and Griggs counties along west line of section 30 Franklin twp; Repair bridges on line between section 3 Edendale and 34 Primrose twps; section 34 and 35 Easton twps; replank and put in new floor joist on old bridge on line between sections 20 and 21 Golden Lake twp.; replank bridge on line between sections 31 and 32 Beaver Creek twp. That the following appropriations be made: \$200. for grading on line between sections 19 and 20 Willow Lake twp; \$125. for grading on line between section 3 Colgate and 36 Hugo twp; \$150. for grading up to bridge on ne 1/4 section 16 Easton twp; and that the following petitions be laid on the table; for bridges on lines between sections 20 and 29 Enger twp; sections 25 and 36 Primrose twp; sections 1 and 12 Colgate twp; sections 20 and 21 Hugo twp; section 18 Colgate and 13 Carpenter twp; along east line section 24 Newburgh twp; also the petition for an appropriation for grading on line between section 10 and 15 Golden Lake twp.

The various banks in the county submitting bids as follows on the average daily balances: Hope National Bank 2 per cent. per annum; First National Bank of Hope, 2 per cent. per annum; Blabon State Bank, 2 per cent. per annum; Colgate State Bank, 2 per cent. per annum; Sharon State Bank, 2 per cent. per annum; First National Bank of Finley, 2 per cent. per annum; State Bank of Finley, 2 per cent. per annum. On motion duly seconded and carried, all the bids were accepted and each one of the banks submitting a bid were designated as county depositories, subject to the filing of a satisfactory bond in the sum of \$10,000. each.

The official bond of J M Johnson, states attorney, in the sum of \$2,000. with the Aetna Indemnity Company of Hartford, Conn., as surety, was on motion approved.

Notice is hereby given, that pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided, I call attention to the following section of the Revised Code of 1905, relating to vital statistics:

§ 289. (Notice to proper officers.) When no physician is employed, it shall be the duty of the parents to give notice to the proper officer within whose jurisdiction they reside, of the births and deaths of their children, or of the presence of any infectious or contagious disease occurring within their household, within twenty-four hours, or three days if outside of incorporated limits of cities, towns and villages as to births and deaths only, of such occurrence and the oldest person next of kin, the keeper or other proper officer of every workhouse, poorhouse, reform school, jail, prison, hospital, asylum, or other public or charitable institution, shall give like notice of any birth, death, infection or contagious disease occurring among the persons under his charge. Whoever neglects or refuses to give such notice within the period of twenty-four hours, or three days if outside of incorporated limits of cities, towns and villages as to births and deaths only after the occurrence of such birth, deaths or infectious or contagious disease, shall upon conviction forfeit a sum not to exceed twenty dollars, to be collected as other fines are collected by law.
