The weather during the past two months has been to severe that it is doubtful if even the oldest North Dokota citizens have seen so fierce a winter, and naturally there are many complaints heard about the severity of our Dakota climate. There is, however, some satisfaction in knowing that other places are not much better of. The following extract from a letter from a friend in southern Minnesota is of course not meant to be taken seriously, but it is a certainty that the weather down there is not of the mildest: "During the last week we have had snow storms so violent that the storms in the 'Woolly West' would be insignificant along side of them. It blew so hard on Jan. 19th and 20th that it changed the location of Sibley county. It picked up the whole area and blew it over into Nicollet county. It also changed the day of the week and the day of the month."
