

## Memoir.

BARNETT—Earth has lost a precious inhabitant in the death, by heart trouble, of Anna Caroline Barnett, at Hope, N. D., Sept. 13, 1898. She was born in Ohio, Feb. 25, 1828, and came to Indiana in the fall of the same year, and remained there until recently, when she came to Hope to visit her son and his family. She was one of the oldest settlers of Clinton county.

In 1844 she was married to T. M. Major, and to them were born three sons and one daughter, Mr. Major and two sons having preceeded her to the Heavenly home.

She was in 1860, married to John Barnett, who died about eight years ago; since which time she has lived with her daughter in Frankfort, Indiana.

Mrs. Barnett was converted about 47 years ago and united with the U. P. church and remained a faithful member of the same until it became extinct. Then she united with the Presbyterian church, and about eight years ago with the Methodist church. She was a woman of thorough consecration and possessed a steadfast faith in God.

Being familiar with the Bible her religion was a religion of intelligence; she was able to give a reason for the hope within. She was thoroughly God's servant in the home, in society, and in the church. Strong in faith, sincere in prayer; she was exemplary in life, and triumphant in death.
