The sad news announcing the death of D. B. Borden, formerly of Broadlawn township, this county, but now of Spokane, Wash., reached friends here last Saturday. It will be remembered that Mr. Borden and family moved to Washington last spring and bought a fruit and timber farm. About a week ago Mr. Borden was engaged in drawing wood to the Spokane market, and while descending a steep hill about two miles from town, the front end of the rack gave way, allowing him and wood to roll down upon the horses, causing them to run away. He was dragged some distance and when picked up, died without uttering a word. He was a member of George P. Foster G. A. R. Post, who will pass fitting reso lutions and same will be published in The Pioneer next week. He left a wife, seven girls and one son, and a host of friends in this vicinity, to mourn. A nobler hearted more honest man, never lived.
