Of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, N. D., April 1st, 1895.

Board of county commissioners met in regular session, at 10 o'clock a. m.

Present, Chairman Brown, and commissioners Williams, Cochran, Rindy and King.

The minutes of the meeting of January 17th, 1895, were read and approved.

The following official bonds were on motion approved:

On motion J. P. Pease was appointed a justice of the peace, to fill vacancy.
