Official Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of Steele County.

Sherbrooke, N. D., July 3, 1890.

Board of county commissioners convened in regular session as provided by law, at 10 o'clock a. m.

Present, Chairman Rindy and Commissioners King, Horner and Erickson.

Minutes of the meeting held on June 10, 1890, were read and on motion approved.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from the county general fund:

The following resignation was presented to the board of county commissioners:

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners, Steele County, N. D.:

Gentlemen:

I hereby tender to your honorable body my resignation as sheriff of Steele county, North Dakota.

John J. Hogen.

On motion the above resignation was laid on the table.

The bill of Arthur McLaughlin amounting to \$3.15 was on motion laid on the table.

The hour of 2 o'clock p. m., having arrived, the board proceeded to open bids for paper for court room, county offices and halls of the county building, and also bids for papering the same.

Wamberg & Jacobson were the only bidders for furnishing paper and on motion their bid offering to furnish the paper selected by the county officers and county commissioners for \$73.92 was accepted.

Arne K. Nybo and A. R. Miller, each submitted bids for papering as follows:

Arne K. Nybo, agreeing to tear off all felt paper where needed and furnish and replace with new and to put on the wall paper complete for \$50, or to perform the work for \$3 per day.

A. R. Miller agreeing to paper complete, perform the work of replacing the felt paper where needed for \$30.40.

After considerable discussion and consideration, on motion the bid of Arne K. Nybo was accepted.

On motion the following bills were laid on the table:

Oscar Barrett, bill of \$14 for labor and material furnished in repairing chimneys of county building, and for lock register of deeds office.

John J. Hogen, bill of \$81.25 for caring for Mrs. Berthe Sodenhold, insane, 13 days and for assistant in care of said insane patient.

Board of county commissioners convened at 10 o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment.

All members present.

The minutes of the meeting of July 3, 1890 were read and on motion approved.

The application of P. P. Rice for the purchase of Steele county's interest in lots 20, 21, 22, 23 and 24, block 36, original townsite of Hope, and agreeing to pay for the same the sum of \$13.54 was presented to the board.

On motion said application was granted, and the chairman directed to execute and the auditor to attest a quitclaim deed of Steele county's interest in said lots to P. P. Rice.

On motion the auditor's statement of salary warrants drawn for salary of county officials of Steele county for second quarter of 1890, was approved as follows:

O W Williams, county treasurer's salary for three months \$345 00

P H Gilbertson, clerk of district court salary for three months 200 00

W I Warrey, county judge salary for three months..... 140 00

W H Butler, county superintendent salary for three months..... 267 51

T S Hunt, county auditor salary for three months..... 342 54

C S Shippy, county attorney salary for three months..... 250 00

Oscar Barrett, register of deeds, salary, paid by deposit of fees 174 25

Jennie Barrett, clerk for register of deeds, salary for three months, paid by deposit of fees..... 100 00

The committee appointed at the meeting of June 10, 1890 to inspect sites for grades where the county had been petitioned to grant appropriations to aid in constructing the same, submitted their report as follows:

We recommend that the petition for an appropriation of \$100 toward the expenses of grading slough between sections 2 and 11, Riverside township, be granted. Also that the county appropriate \$175 toward grading the slough between sections 11 and 12, Hope township.

Said appropriations to be paid upon presentation to the board of county commissioners of the proper vouchers, together with satisfactory proof that the grades have been completed.

Upon motion said report was accepted and approved and the committee discharged.

The following resolution was, on motion adopted:

Resolved that until otherwise ordered the treasurer of Steele county be and is hereby authorized to pay to Mrs. Cyrus, poor person, the sum of \$17 per month during the months of May, June, July, August, September and October, and the sum of \$23 per month during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April, and further the public is hereby warned that Steele county will pay no bills of any kind contracted by or for Mrs. Cyrus, poor person.

On motion the board adjourned until 4 o'clock p. m., July 6, 1890.
