On motion it was ordered that an appropriation of \$100.00, be allowed Greenview township, to assist in grading the slough between sections 14 and 23 in said town, said amount to be paid on vouchers being presented by the town board thereof.

The board took up the consideration of the appropriation of \$150.00 to Hope township to be used in lumber for bridge and grading approaches, thereto, between sections 26 and 27, on July 13, 1898.

On motion it was ordered that said amount be paid as granted on July 13, 1898, viz: When said improvements are completed and the proper vouchers presented to this board.

The committees appointed Oct. 3, 1898 to inspect the sites of bridges between sections 28 and 33, Westfield township, and between sections 6, in Primrose and section 1, in Sherbrooke, made and filed their reports.

On motion said reports were accepted and committees discharged, and further action in regard to said bridges deferred until the January meeting of the board.

The application of F. R. Rugg to purchase lots 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 in block 29, original townsite of Hope agreeing to pay the sum of \$23.28 therefor was presented to the board.

On motion said application was granted and the chairman directed to execute and the auditor to attest a quit claim deed of said premises to F. R. Rugg.

The application of Adam S. Moote to purchase the interest of the county in and to lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, block 8, original townsite of Hope, agreeing to pay the sum of \$14.75 therefor, was presented to the board.

On motion said application was granted, and the chairman of the board directed to execute and the county auditor to attest a quit claim deed of said premises to Adam S. Moote.

The application of Adam S. Moote to purchase the interest of the county in and to lots 1, 2, and 3, original townsite of Hope agreeing to pay the sum of \$14.20 therefor was presented to the board.

On motion said application was granted, and the chairman of the board directed to execute, and the county auditor to attest a quit claim deed of said premises to Adam S. Moote.

On motion the bond of the county treasurer elect was fixed at the sum of \$75,000.00.

On motion the bond of the sheriff elect was fixed at the sum of \$5,000.00.

On motion the bond of the coroner elect was fixed at the sum of \$600.00.

On motion the Finley Golden Slope, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the village of Finley, in Steele county, N. D., was designated as the newspaper in which the sheriff of the county of Steele, N. D., shall give the notice of tax judgement sale of all tracts of land and buildings against which judgement has been or may be rendered according to the provisions of chapter 28 session laws of 1897, and said sheriff directed to give notice therein and to sell the said tracts or parcels of land and the buildings thereon as provided by said law.
