Sherbrooke, N. D., Aug. 29, 1898.

Board of county commissioners convened at 10 o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment.

Present O. W. Williams, chairman, and Commissioners King, Johnson, Rindy and Cochrane.

The minutes of the meeting of Aug. 8, 1898, were read and approved.

Board reconvened at 1:30 o'clock p. m. pursuant to adjournment. All members present.

On motion the auditor was instructed to advertise for bids to furnish the county with 24 tons of hard stove coal to be delivered at Finley, on or before November 15, 1898, and also for hauling same from Finley and depositing in cellar under court house.

A requisition was received from the clerk of the district court calling for the names of 24 persons to complete the jury list of the county.

On motion said names were apportioned among the several towns in the county as follows:

Norway, Westfield, Norman, Golden Lake, Highland, Bergen, Primrose, Sherbrooke, Easton, Greenview, Edendale, Lincoln, Melrose, Riverside, Broadlawn, Colgate, Hope township, and Willow Lake, one name each; and Newburgh, Eager and Incorporated Town of Hope, two names each.

The application of Mrs. Mary A. Milligan to purchase the interest of the county in and to lots 13 and 14, block 27 original townsite of Hope, agreeing to pay the sum of \$650 therefor, was presented to the board.

On motion said application was granted, and the chairman directed to execute, and the auditor to attest, a quit claim deed of said premises to said Mary A. Milligan.

On motion Dr. W. D. Wagar was appointed as a member of the board of health to fill vacancy now existing there on.

The committees appointed May 7, 1898, to inspect the nine bridges to be built in 1898, by Dibley & Robinson, made and filed their reports, approving said bridges and recommending the acceptance of said bridges as complete.

On motion said reports were accepted approved and committees ordered discharged, and payment of the full amount of balance due on contract for construction of said bridges in the amount of \$1,250.00, be paid on presentation of the proper voucher.
