## PIONEER GONE.

MRS. FULLER, ONE OF THE OLD SETTLERS, PASSES AWAY.

Mrs. S. C. Fuller, one of Steele County's oldest and most highly respected citizens, passed peacefully and quietly away last Friday afternoon after an illness of about three months. After returning last spring from a visit to relatives and friends in the east Mrs. Fuller complained of feeling unwell and gradually grew worse. Medical assistance was called but norelief was effected. A consultation was held and the trouble diagnosed as cancer of the liver. Everything possible was done to stay the dread disease but without avail and Friday afternoon the soul left the troubled body and returned to rest with its Maker.

Mrs. Fuller, the daughter of Olney and Lydia Randall, was born in Jefferson county, N. Y. Nov. 2nd, 1840. She was married to Sidney C. Fuller July 1st 1864 and they moved to Bloomington, Ill. in 1856 where they made their home until the spring of 1883 when they came to Steele county where they have since made their home. Mrs Fuller leaves a husband, seven children, a father, two brothers, and two sisters and a bost of friends to mourn her early demise. She was a genuinely good, conscien-tious Christian woman. The fateral was held Sunday afternoon at 2 o clock from the residence. The casket was beautifully decorated with flowers which were sent by loving neighbors and friends. The remains were laid to rest in the Hope cemetery and were escorted to their last resting place by the largest procession in the history of this locality.
