#### AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Board of County Commissioners reconvened at 1.30 p. m. pursuant to adjournment. All members present.

The following bridge and grade petitions were presented to the Board:

Petition of Walter Swanson and others, for a bridge across coulee on line between sec. 1 Melrose and 33 Easton townships, and an appropriation of \$200 to help grade down hills on each side of said coulee.

Petition of P. J. Hanson and others for an appropriation of \$100 to assist in grading across a coulee between sections 1 and 12 Bergen Township.

Petition signed by Andrew Rasmussen and others for an appropriation of \$250 for grading across slough, on line between sections 5 and 6, Willow Lake township.

Petition signed by the Board of Supervisors of Sherbrooke township, for an appropriation of \$250 to assist in grading the hill south of the bridge on the river between sections 32 and 33 in said township.

Petition of H. A. Bjerke and others to repair county bridge on line between sections 3 Edendale and 34 Primrose townships.
