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Sunday noon Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Graham's baby girl, about two and a half years old, got hold of a box of morphine and when the parents discovered what was transpiring the little one was in the act of eating the tablets, evidently thinking the drug was candy. An emetic was quickly administered and a physician called who used every possible means to keep the child awake. About eight o'clock the effects of the dose began to wear off and Monday morning the little tot seemed little the worse for the experience which came so near ending fatally. The morphine had been purchased on Saturday and several of the tablets had been used by Mrs. Graham for neuralgia. Those remaining were left in a spare room seldom occupied and no one ever thought of the baby straying into it.
