The board of county commissioners reconvened at 1:30 p. m. Present—K. S. Sulland, G. O. Johnson, K. A. Johnson, H. N. Horner. On motion the chairman appointed H. N. Horner, G. O. Johnson, K. A. Johnson and himself as a committee to check up the accounts and records of the county treasurer, which work was taken up by the committee and continued until completed, when they reported finding the cash accounts and balances as follows:

On motion, seconded and carried, K. S. Sulland was chosen chairman of the board of review and equalization.

For the purpose of equalization the average value of horses 1 year old was on motion placed at \$13, and increased and decreased in the several assessment districts by the following per centum:

Increased—Newburgh, 4 per cent; Beaver Creek, 10 per cent; Sharon, 32 per cent; Enger, 33 per cent; Finley twp., 8½ per cent; Franklin, 30 per cent; Primrose, 11 per cent; Edendale, 8½ per cent; Hugo, 3 per cent. Decreased—Westfield, 7 per cent; Golden Lake, 7 per cent; Sherbrooke, 4 per cent; Easton, 7 per cent; Greenview, 7 per cent; Melrose, 5 per cent; Riverside, 5 per cent; Broadlawn, 7 per cent; Colgate, 7 per cent; Carpenter, 14 per cent; Willow Lake, 2 per cent; Finley village, 7 per cent.

The average value of horses 2 years old was on motion placed at \$20, and increased and decreased in the several districts as follows:

Increased—Beaver Creek, 4 per cent; Sharon, 35 per cent; Enger, 33½ per cent; Franklin, 16 per cent; Hugo, 11 per cent; Melrose, 18 per cent; Hope city, 3 per cent; Finley village, 7 per cent. Decreased—Newburgh, 2 per cent; Westfield, 9 per cent; Golden Lake, 9 per cent; Sherbrooke, 7 per cent; Easton, 9 per cent; Greenview, 9 per cent; Riverside, 8 per cent; Broadlawn, 10 per cent; Colgate, 10 per cent; Carpenter, 1 per cent; Willow Lake, 5 per cent. No change in Finley twp., Primrose and Edendale.

The average value of horses 3 years old and over was on motion placed at \$33 and increased and decreased in the several assessment districts as follows: Increased—Newburgh, 3 per cent; Beaver Creek, 4 per cent; Sharon, 16 per cent; Enger, 16 per cent; Finley township, 28 per cent; Franklin, 3 per cent; Primrose, 1 per cent; Edendale, 3 per cent; Hugo, 10 per cent; Willow Lake, 16 per cent; Hope city, 4 per cent; Finley village, 19 per cent. Decreased—Westfield, 3 per cent; Golden Lake, 3 per cent; Sherbrooke, 1 per cent; Easton, 3 per cent; Greenview, 3 per cent; Riverside, 8 per cent; Broadlawn, 3 per cent; Colgate, 1 per cent; Carpenter, 7 per cent. No change made in Melrose.

The average value of stallions kept for service was on motion placed at \$125 and increased and decreased in the several assessment districts as
