A communication was received from F. E. Curry stating that the s ½ of block 3 and the n ½ of block 6, in the second addition to Finley, belonged to the Village of Finley, was used for public purposes, and asked to have the said lots taken from the assessment roll and placed upon the exempt list. On motion it was ordered that the s ½ of block 3 and n ½ of block 6, in the second addition to the Village of Finley, be stricken from the assessment roll and placed upon the list of exempt property.
