The above is the proper announcement of an event which took place a week ago, which, instead of being the usual happy event, has its dark side. The principals, with Miss Annie, an older sister of the bride, and Theo. Newton for witnesses, drove to Sherbrooke, where the groom applied for a license in the usual manner, swearing that the young lady was over 18 years of age. Here is where he made a serious mistake, as the parents, Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Leiske, state the gul is only 16 years old.

As soon as Mr. Leiske learned of what had happened he drove to town and taking Chas. E. Mitchell with him, drove to Oscar Larson's, three and a half miles south of town, and securing the girl, took her home.

Friday afternoon, after investigating the matter, Mr. Leiske swore to a complaint before Justice Monteith charging Gustafson with perjury, and a warrant was issued.
