

James Scott

Passes Away.

Died, at his home at Ashtabula, Barnes Co., N. D., Wednesday morning at 4:30, July 8th 1908, James Scott, aged seventy-two years three months and fourteen days.

The deceased was a man highly esteemed and respected by all who knew him and was found walking in the well beaten path of righteousness and when conscious that he was nearing the end of his earthly life he more fully realized, and as the final summons came, he was deeply impressed with the fact that at the end of time eternity began, and that the same faith which sustains all christian loving people was with him during those trying hours of suffering and was only growing brighter and brighter as he journeyed toward the infinite, and the final gloom of death be dispelled by the love of his Maker.

The deceased has been a constant sufferer with throat trouble during the past year and it was but last Saturday that he returned to his home from Valley City, where he has been under the care of a specialist for some time.

The funeral services will be held from the Baldwin Presbyterian church to-morrow and will be conducted by the pastor, Rev. Robertson. All that is mortal of our friend and neighbor will be laid at peaceful rest in our silent city.

James Scott was born at Lanarkshire, Scotand, March 24th 1836. He was converted at an early age and was of Presbyterian faith. He was united in marriage to Harret E. Wilson, March 10th 1864, unto which union eight children were born five of whom are still living: Mrs C. S. Matcer, Huron S. D., Mrs. Adj. McRae, Regina, Saak., Mrs. Hector McKay, Hope. N. D., Janet Lousin Scott, Ashtabula, N. D., S. D. Scott, Hope, N. D. On October 22nd 1879 his beloved wife was called to the Great Beyond. In October 1880 he and his children came to America and resided in Wabasha Co., Minn., till April of 1891, when they moved to Hope, N. D. On March 10th 1902 he was married to Sarah F. Hurd and has since that time resided on his farm at Ashtabula, N. D. He leaves besides his wife and five children, two brothers and two sisters who reside in far off Scotland.
