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Melrose, Riverside, Carpenter and Willow Lake.

The valuation of structures on city lots was on motion increased 10 per cent in Sherbrooke. No change made in Sharon, Blabon, Colgate, Hope city and Finley Village.

The value of town lots exclusive of structures was on motion increased 10 per cent in Colgate. No change made in Sharon, Sherbrooke, Blabon, Hope city and Finley village.

The valuation of farm lands exclusive of structures was on motion increased in the various assessment districts by the following per centum: Newburgh 5 per cent, Beaver Creek 25 per cent, Sharon 7 per cent, Enger 25 per cent, Golden Lake 20 per cent, Finley 10 per cent, Franklin 10 per cent, Primrose 23 per cent, Sherbrooke 10 per cent, Easton 5 per cent, Edendale 17 per cent, Hugo 2 per cent, Riverside 12 per cent, Colgate 2 per cent. No change made in Westfield, Greenview, Melrose, Broadlawn, Carpenter and Willow Lake. No change made in the valuation of the unplatted portion of Hope city and Finley village.

It was on motion ordered that E. R. Anderson be assessed 1200 bu. of wheat and R. A. Miller 2000 bu of wheat, and that the same be placed upon the Sherbrooke assessment roll; no grain having been assessed to the above named individuals.

On motion the board of review and equalization adjourned and met as a regular board of county commissioners. Minutes of the meeting of July 2nd and 3rd 1907, read and on motion approved. On motion adjournment was taken until 1 o'clock P. M. same day.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The board of county commissioners reconvened at 1 o'clock P. M. All members present.

The justice report of T S Hunt for quarter ending June 30th 1907, was on motion approved; all costs and fees having been paid and a balance of \$52.40 remitted to the county treasurer.

The statements of fees collected by the Register of Deeds for quarter ending June 30th 1907, aggregating \$540.75 was on motion approved.

The statements of fees collected by the Clerk of Court for quarter ending June 30th 07, aggregating 433.00, was on motion approved.

On motion duly seconded and carried the following sums of money were voted to be raised upon the taxable property of the county for the current fiscal year:

For county general fund, sixteen thousand dollars.....	\$16000 00
For bridge fund, seven thousand dollars.....	7000 00
For care of patients at State Hospital for Insane, one thousand dollars.....	1000 00

NOTICE TO CONSTRUCT SIDEWALKS

To the owner and occupant of the respective premises hereinafter described:

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Hope, North Dakota, deem it necessary to construct a sidewalk in front of the following described premises as herein set forth to-wit:

In front of lots (4) (5) (6) in block eight (8) and lots (4) (5) and (6) in block six (6) original townsite of City of Hope North Dakota.

And have directed the City Auditor of said City to notify you, as provided by law, to construct such sidewalk in front of said premises which is owned or occupied by you, and at your own expense.

NOW THEREFORE, you are hereby notified and required to construct such sidewalk in front of, as above set forth, the premises hereinbefore described, which is owned by you, subject to approval of the Street Commissioner of said City, and in strict accordance with specifications for the same set forth in an ordinance passed by the City Council of the said City, entitled: "An Ordinance Relating to the Construction and repair of Sidewalks, How and of What Materials the Same Shall be Built and Prescribing the Dimensions Thereof;" approved May 8th A. D. 1905, at your own expense, within twenty (20) days after the date of this notice:

And if you fail to construct the same, such sidewalks will be constructed by the contractor employed by the said City for that purpose, and the expense thereof will be assessed against said described premises.

Said sidewalk must, according to said ordinance, conform to the established grade, which will be given you by the Street Commissioner upon application.
