

AN ORDINANCE

To prevent the erection of elevators without having them enclosed with iron.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cooperstown.

Section 1. Whereas the construction of elevators within the limits of the City of Cooperstown without having them inclosed with iron is a great menace to other property, it is hereby ordered, that hereafter all wooden elevator buildings constructed or moved within the limits of the City of Cooperstown shall be enclosed or sided with sheet iron both sides and roof.

Section 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of one hundred dollars for each and every day said elevator shall stand unprotected with sheet iron.

This ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication.
