

To the Patrons of the City School.

Your attention is called to the fact that our school will open on the 6th day of September, and you are reminded that as far as possible all pupils should enter at the beginning of the school year. The loss of one or two months is a handicap to which pupils should not be subject. As heretofore in the beginner's room, those who will come six years old on or before the first of January, will be admitted at the opening of school on September 6, and should enter then as it may be impossible to admit them on the first of January. To our already liberal course of study the board has added manual training and domestic science, so that the boys will

have instruction and practice in wood work and the girls in sewing, etc. More than ordinary effort has been made to secure a corps of excellent teachers, and the school will open September sixth with every prospect for a better year's work than ever before. Remember that our high school is first-class, and those holding diplomas from it are admitted to college or university without examination.
