

PROCEEDINGS

Of the Board of County Commissioners of Griggs County, North Dakota.

June 6th.

The board convened pursuant to adjournment June 6th, 1910, with all the members present.

The construction of four steel bridges having been authorized to replace the old wooden bridges known as the Qualey, Hogenson, Tande and Mogaard bridges, and it having been decided that three of the bridges, those across the Sheyenne river, should be 80 feet long, 18 feet wide and 12 feet high above low water, with substructure of steel piles and concrete backing; and the fourth bridge, which is across a branch of Ball Hill Creek, to be 24 feet long, 18 feet wide and 13 feet high, proposals were, at this time, opened for the construction of such bridges, as follows:

Hewett Bridge Co., for the four bridges \$12,200; Fargo Bridge & Iron Co., for the four bridges \$12,145; Joliet Bridge & Iron Co., for the four bridges \$12,175; Central States Bridge Co., for the four bridges \$12,704; Iowa Bridge Co., for the four bridges \$12,349; Minneapolis Bridge & Iron Co., for the four bridges \$11,550; Geo. F. Ivory & Co., for the four bridges \$12,340; Penn Bridge Co., for the three 80 ft bridges only \$11,400.

It was moved, seconded and carried, ordering that the bid of The Minneapolis Bridge & Iron Co. be accepted and that the chairman of the board be authorized to execute the contract for the county. The contract provides for the completion of the bridges on or before Sept. 6, 1910.

The minutes of the preceding meeting of the board were read and declared approved.

The members of the board of supervisors of Lenora township appeared and explained the necessity of an increased appropriation to their township for grading on the south line of section 34 of said township. At the last session \$200 was appropriated for this purpose, and on motion made, seconded and carried an additional sum of \$200 was allowed.

A petition was received signed by Anton Pederson and others of Willow township, asking for aid in grading a road on the south side of sections 15 and 16 in said township. It was moved and seconded that \$500 be appropriated to Willow township to be used as specified in the petition. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the auditor be directed to advertise for bids for grading a road on the north side of section 3 and between sections 2 and 3 in Bryan township, according to specifications on file with Commissioner Buchheit, who is authorized to receive bids and let the contract for the same. Motion carried.
