

# PROCEEDINGS

## OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GRIGGS COUNTY, N. D.

April 3rd.  
The Board convened in regular session April 3rd, 1911, with all members present.

The minutes of the preceding session were read and approved.

A petition was presented signed by the township supervisors and others of Broadway township and of Willow Lake Township in Steele county, asking for the construction of a grade on the county line between Griggs and Steele counties on the east side of Section 24 Broadway township, such grade to be constructed jointly by the two counties. A motion was made, seconded and carried, by which the Board agreed to appropriate to Broadway township one-half the cost of constructing such grade, provided that the appropriation shall not exceed \$300.00.

Chas. O. Johnson appeared before the Board and presented a petition from the board of supervisors of Pilot Mound township praying for an appropriation of \$150.00 to aid in constructing a bridge across the creek between sections 7 and 18 in such township. The petition was, on motion, granted.

The continuation certificate for the bond of Nels P. Nelson as Abstractor, covering the ensuing year was received and filed.

On motion the Board adjourned until 9 o'clock a. m., April 4th.

April 4th.  
The Board convened pursuant to adjournment with all members present. The new highway law and the appointment of a County Superintendent of Highways was considered. By motion, made, seconded and unanimously carried, Martin A. Ueland was appointed County Superintendent of Highways at an annual salary of \$800.00, it being agreed between Mr. Ueland and the Board that any public duties as County Surveyor will be performed by the Superintendent of Highways.

The surety bond of R. M. Cowen as county auditor, in the sum of \$5,000, was approved by the Board after being approved by the States Attorney as to form.

The private bond of Martin A. Ueland as County Supt. of Highways, in the sum of \$1,000 was approved by the Board after being approved by the States Attorney as to form.

On motion the 1910 school poll tax of \$1.00 assessed against Hammerood Co. in error, was ordered refunded.

The bill of Iver L. Skaar for \$188.77 which was considered and rejected at the January session was reconsidered and, on motion allowed, at \$35.00, this being for caps of the poor in the case of John Thuse.

The bill of the McCoy Lumber Co. for \$33.15 for lumber furnished the poor, which bill was rejected at the Feb. 21st session, was reconsidered and allowed at \$34.15, it being agreed that the lumber company shall file a lien against the building containing the material for the benefit of the county.
