

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GRIGGS COUNTY, N. D.

The Board convened pursuant to adjournment July 17th, 1911, with all the members present.

The minutes of the preceding session were read and approved.

The Board of Equalization resumed work and took up the equalization of assessments on shares of bank stock. On motion it was ordered that for the purpose of equalization the assessed valuations of bank stock in the city of Coopers-town be reduced 30 per cent.

This completed the equalization of the assessments and the Board proceeded to a consideration of the tax levies.

The Auditor presented an itemized statement of the probable county expenditures during the ensuing year and also an estimate of the miscellaneous receipts, as follows:

A motion was made, seconded and carried, ordering that the following sums be raised by a levy on all the taxable property in the county:

For General Fund ..	\$16 000 00
For Bridge Fund ..	6 000 00
For Sinking Fund ..	1 000 00
For Insane Fund ..	1 000 00
For Interest Fund ..	1 800 00

That a tax of one mill be levied on all the taxable property in the county for an emergency fund, and that a tax of one-fifth of a mill be levied on all the taxable property in the county for the benefit of the Griggs County Fair.

The business of checking the County Treasurer's office was taken up.

On motion the Board adjourned until 9 o'clock a. m. July 18th.

The Board convened pursuant to adjournment with all the members present.

The checking of the treasurer's office was completed and everything found correct.

The Board proceeded to act on the resignation of Commissioner Jones, the following communication having been filed:

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners:—Owing to the fact that I am to move away from the 4th Commissioner's District, I hereby hand you my resignation.

On motion made, seconded and carried, the resignation of Commissioner Jones was accepted.

For the purpose of taking up the appointment of a new commissioner for the 4th District, the County Judge and County Auditor joined

the remaining members of the Board and the matter was considered.

On motion, made, seconded and carried, B. N. Howden of Mabel township was appointed County Commissioner for the 4th District to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of R. L. Jones.
