OF THE

Board of County Commissioners,
Griggs County, North Dakota.

OFFICIAL PUBLICATION.

Board met according to law this 2nd day of April, 1906. All members present.

Minutes of the preceding session read and approved.

The county surveyor was directed to proceed with a county board committee to survey and make recommendations as to building a grade or building a bridge in Sverdrup township and the auditor was directed to advertise for bids for the work recommended.

On motion Commissioner Lucken was appointed a committee to accompany the surveyor in connection with the work in Sverdrup township.

By motion the board agreed to pay for the material necessary for a foot bridge across the Sheyenne river between Sec. 6 and 7 in Romness township.

On motion the county surveyor was directed to survey the road between Sec. 24 and 25 in Pilot Mound and also to do sufficient surveying to make a recommendation as to the practicability of draining the slough which the road crosses and the auditor was directed to advertise for bids for the grading reported by the surveyor.

On motion the Board agreed to pay half the expense of building a bridge and grade on Barnes County line on south side of Sec. 32 of Greenfield township, and Commissioner Nelson was appointed a committee to attend to the matter in connection with the Barnes County officials. A motion was made and carried granting a refund of \$69.91 to J. H. Hogenson, administrator of the estate of Martin Johnson, being taxes collected on the ne 1/4 Sec. 29-148-58, while the land was not assessable, as follows:

On motion it was ordered that the 1905 taxes on lot 12 of ne 1/4 of nw 1/4 Sec. 25-146-59 be abated for the reason that the lot is a part of the N. P. Ry station grounds and is included in the regular Ry assessment is returned by the said board of equalization.

The auditor's warrant No. 1961, issued for \$120 for the purpose of sending Wm. Murdock to Hunters Hot Springs for medical treatment, was duly approved.

Joseph Ebentire was by motion appointed assessor for the 2nd District.

The 1905 taxes assessed against J. F. Van Voorhis on the ne 1/4 of ne 1/4 Sec. 14-148-61, \$7.79 were by motion ordered abated for the reason that final proof has not been made on the land and it is not assessable.

On motion the 1905 taxes \$46.92 on the e 1/2 Sec. 9-145-60 were ordered refunded to Mrs. E. G. Lewis for the reason that the taxes were paid twice, receipts No. 1351 and 1463.

On motion the school pool tax of \$1.00 for 1904 against Chas. Graff of Lenora township was ordered refunded for the reason that the person assessed was not twenty-one years of age.

The auditor was by motion given authority to draw his warrant in favor of the Griggs County Fair Association for the money now in the Treasury for that account.

The following resolution was duly passed by the board: Whereas the inspectors of election of the village of Binford have made due return of their proceedings had a special election held to vote on the proposed incorporation of the village of Binford showing that a majority of the qualified votes assented thereto. It is resolved that an order be entered declaring that said village has been regularly incorporated under the name of the Village of Binford.

Motion made, seconded and carried that the account of \$1631.02 carried by Griggs County, as an asset against the defunct Citizens National Bank of Fargo, N. D., be cancelled as uncollectable and the county treasurer authorized to make proper entries on his records to wipe out said account.

By motion Emil Simonson was appointed to appraise estrays taken up by Peter Stromme in Washburn township.

The 1905 school poll tax \$1 in Bartley township was ordered refunded to W. K. Markuson for the reason that he paid in two districts.

By motion duly carried the following places were named as places at which chattle mortgage property should be sold: Flynn's feed barn, Cooperstown; Richardson & Haugen's livery barn, Hannaford; Krogfoss' livery barn, Binford; Hanson's livery barn, Walum; Hjort & Thinglestad's livery barn, Jessie.
